Monitoring Tonic/Clonic Seizures throughout the day and night

Recently Epilepsy Solutions were approached by Suffolk County Council, looking at an assistive technology solution for Christopher, 36, who suffers with Tonic Clonic seizures which occur frequently during the day and night. He lives alone and frequently collapses as a result of his epilepsy which goes undetected and results in numerous injuries.



The Solution

We supplied the **Smart Watch** linked to his mobile which immediately sent an alert his brother. Christopher found the watch comfortable to wear throughout the day and night and when a seizure took place the **Smart Watch** sent an alarm via his mobile phone to his brother who could summon assistance, it also gives a GPS location directly to his brothers mobile phone.

Prior to the **Smart Watch**, Christopher not only suffered injury through his seizures which went undetected but he was very uneasy about going out, even to the local shops. The **Smart Watch** has given him increased independence, which has allowed him to go out more often and given peace of mind and reassurance to his family.

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
